The SAMOSA festival (www.samosafestival.com), established in 2005 as the cultural arm of AwaaZ Magazine (www.awaazmagazine.com), is a crosscultural festival. SYNOPSIS

As India, the world's largest democracy, braces itself for another general election- with 9 million polling booths, more than 800 million voters, and costing nearly \$5 billion. Newton Kumar, a rookie government clerk finds himself entrusted with a task that appears deceptively simple: conducting elections in a remote village in the jungles of central India. The bushes teem with Communist guerrillas, who have been waging a decades old war against the state, even as the indigenous tribals live without any access to mainland amenities. Conducting 'free and fair' elections in a minefield like this is no child's play, as Newton learns over the course of this eventful day. SYNOPSIS:

A film about love, hate and being transgender in one of the world's most transphobic places. Uganda, a small land-locked country in East Africa. Once named THE PEARL OF AFRICA by Winston Churchill. A country blessed with its diversity in ethnicity, gender, flora and fauna. Yet in all this richness it struggles to recognise & appreciate this diversity. Enter the life of Cleopatra Kambugu, a 27 year old Ugandan Transgender Woman. She's biologically born male, but against all odds transitioning into the woman she knows she was born to be. In the film we get to follow her as she questions gender expression and identity, reshape attitudes and uncover the realities of a people whose existence has been shrouded in myth and prejudice.

'FGM refers to all procedures that involve the <u>partial or total removal</u> of the external female genitalia or other injury to the female genital organs for non-medical reasons. It is incredibly painful, traumatizes girls and results in numerous negative health consequences that last decades. It can even cause death. It is also a form of violence against girls, exacerbating a vicious cycle of oppression and poverty that prevents them from fully participating in their country's long-term progress. Globally, it is estimated that over 140 million girls and women have undergone some form of FGM. Currently, more than three million girls, the majority under 15 years of age, undergo the procedure each year. In Kenya, even in 2014, FGM is an all too painful reality for generations of women and girls' Siddhartha *Chatterjee, United Nations Resident Coordinator to Kenya*

"BETWEEN US" - A PUPPETRY PERFORMANCE ON GENDER, RACE, IDENTITY AND HUMAN RIGHTS

Puppetry is a form of theatre or performance that involves the manipulation of puppets – inanimate objects, often resembling some type of human or animal figure that are animated or manipulated by a human called a puppeteer. Such a performance is also known as a **puppet play**. The puppeteer uses movements of her hands, arms, or control devices such as rods or strings to move the body, head, limbs, and in some cases the mouth and eyes of the puppet. The puppeteer often speaks in the voice of the character of the puppet, and then synchronizes the movements of the puppet's mouth with this spoken part. The actions, gestures and spoken parts acted out by the puppets are typically used in storytelling.

Kenya Institute of Puppet Theatre (KIPT) will present a 45 minute to an hours performance titled "Between us" which will explore the complex issue of discrimination through the eyes of victims of abuse, torture, stigma and oppression. Through an audio visual display, using puppets, masks,



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spoken word and music, the show follows in the footsteps of men and women who triumph in the face of hardship.

KIPT is a dynamic, innovative and creative community based institution that uses creative research, interactive media, puppetry, participatory educational theatre and folk media in life skills promotion, community education and cultural communication that engages people into interactive discourse
